### QUENTIN BAILEY, CARBONDALE, SENTENCED TO DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS FOR FIRST DEGREE MURDER AND ROBBERY

State's Attorney for Jackson County, Illinois, Michael C. Carr, announced today that Quentin M. Bailey, 23, of Carbondale was sentenced to serve 85 years in the Illinois Department of Corrections after being found guilty of First Degree Murder and Robbery by a Jackson County Jury on July 22, 2016.

Bailey was convicted of First Degree Murder and Robbery in relation to a shooting incident which occurred at a hotel parking lot on May 10, 2015, on the East Side of Carbondale near Reed Station Road. The victim of the shooting, Broderick Miller of Marion, passed away following the initial charges.

The jury found that that Bailey, while committing a forcible felony, Robbery, fired a .380 caliber handgun at Miller, thereby causing the death of Miller. The robbery charge alleges that Bailey took cannabis from the presence of Miller by the use of or threatened use of imminent force. The Carbondale Police Department were alerted to the offense when a witness left the victim at Carbondale Memorial Hospital. Bailey, who was on supervised release from the Department of Corrections for a previous armed robbery, was located the following day by law enforcement at a residence located South Emerald Lane in Carbondale. The residence had been broken into without the authorization of the owner.

This case was investigated by the Carbondale Police Department, the Illinois State Police Forensic Crime Center, the U.S. Marshal's Service, and the Illinois Department of Corrections. State's Attorney Michael C. Carr and Assistant State's Attorney Abigail Dinn handled the prosecution.
