TYRONE C. WEBB, MURPHYSBORO, FOUND GUILTY OF AGGRAVATED DOMESTIC BATTERY AND RELATED CHARGES

A Jackson County Jury returned guilty verdicts on Tuesday, December 13, 2016, against a Murphysboro man for the charges of Aggravated Domestic Battery, Aggravated Battery, and Domestic Battery following a two-day jury trial, the State's Attorney for Jackson County, Illinois, Michael C. Carr, announced today.

The evidence presented at trial showed that Webb battered his girlfriend over a period of five days in May 2016, causing bruising to her head, arms, and side. On the fifth day, he cut her thigh with a razor blade, which required medical treatment and multiple staples to close the wound.

Aggravated Domestic Battery is a Class 2 Felony which carries maximum penalty of up to seven (7) years in the Illinois Department of Corrections. Aggravated Battery, a Class 3 Felony, carries a penalty of up to five (5) years imprisonment. Domestic Battery is a Class A Misdemeanor, which carries a maximum penalty of up to one (1) year in the county jail.

A sentencing hearing is scheduled for February 16, 2017. Webb will remain in custody without bond until he is sentenced.

This case was investigated by the Jackson County Sheriff's Office. Assistant State's Attorney Penny Pierson was responsible for the prosecution of this case.
