HARRISON MCDADE, CARBONDALE, SENTENCED TO DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS FOR FORGERY AND PROBATION VIOLATION

Michael C. Carr, Jackson County State's Attorney, announced today that Harrison McDade, 49, of Carbondale, Illinois, was sentenced to serve fifty-four (54) months in the Illinois Department of Corrections following a plea of guilty on April 27, 2017, to the charge of Forgery. The prison sentence will be followed by a one (1) year period of Mandatory Supervised Release.

On November 30, 2016, McDade committed the criminal offense of forgery in that he used a debit card to make a purchase at ABC Liquor Mart in Carbondale. McDade did so without authorization from the account holder. Video surveillance within the store depicted McDade using the debit card and signing the merchant receipt, forging the account holder's name.

McDade was also sentenced to the Illinois Department of Corrections for violating a probation order in a previous matter. On July 19, 2015, McDade committed the offense of Aggravated Battery and was subsequently sentenced to serve thirty (30) months of court probation. After admitting to violating the terms of the probation Order, McDade was re-sentenced to serve another term of fifty-four (54) months in the Illinois Department of Corrections, followed by a two (2) year period of Mandatory Supervised Release. The two sentences will be served concurrently.

The investigation was conducted by the Carbondale Police Department. Assistant State's Attorney Rebecca L. Blomer was responsible for the prosecution of this case.
