### CASEY R. CROW, MURPHYSBORO, FOUND GUILTY OF RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY

A Jackson County Jury returned a guilty verdict against Casey R. Crow, 33, of Murphysboro, Illinois, for one count of Residential Burglary, a Class 1 Felony, following a two-day jury trial, Michael C. Carr, State's Attorney for Jackson County, Illinois, announced today.

On October 21, 2017, Crow entered a residence on Palm Lane in Murphysboro through a window and stole property belonging to the residents. Crow did not have authorization to enter the residence. A neighbor who observed a car in the victim's driveway became suspicious and called the sheriff, who was able to locate the car and recover items taken from the burglary. Upon further investigation, the defendant was identified as the person who entered the residence. A sentencing hearing is scheduled on March 27, 2018, at 2:00 p.m. The defendant will remain in custody at the Jackson County Jail without bond awaiting sentencing.

Residential Burglary carries a maximum sentencing range of four (4) to fifteen (15) years in the Illinois Department of Corrections.

This case was investigated by the Jackson County Sheriff's Office. Assistant State's Attorney Rebecca Blomer was responsible for the prosecution of this case.
