### **JAMES MICHAEL DEESE, DE SOTO, INDICTED FOR FIRST DEGREE MURDER**

Michael C. Carr, Jackson County State's Attorney, announced today, the return of a three count Information relating to the death of DeSoto resident Frank Stonemark, 76, of DeSoto, Illinois.

James Michael Deese, age 52, of DeSoto, Illinois, has been charged in Circuit Court in Jackson County, Illinois, with the Murder of Frank Stonemark in a three count Information filed Friday, March 23, 2018, by the State's Attorney. The Information alleges that Deese killed Stonemark by strangling him and choking him on or about October 29, 2017. Deese is charged in a second count with concealing the death of Stonemark with knowledge that Stonemark had died by homicidal means. He is also charged in a third count with moving the body from the place of death with intent to conceal information regarding the place and manner of the death.

If convicted of First Degree Murder as alleged in Count 1, the sentence which must be imposed is a sentence of 20 to 60 years' imprisonment. Probation is not authorized and there is no early release program available. Concealment of a Homicidal Death is a class three felony which carries potentially a sentence of 2-5 years' imprisonment. Count 3, Concealment of a Death is a class 4 felony which carries a potential sentence of 1-3 years imprisonment. Counts two and three are probationable.

*An Information is merely a charge and not evidence. Under the law, a defendant is presumed to be innocent of a charge until proved guilty beyond a reasonable doubt to the satisfaction of a jury.*

The defendant is currently in custody on a one-million-dollar bond after having made his first court appearance on Friday, March 23, 2018. His case is set for a preliminary hearing on April 4, 2018, in Jackson County Circuit Court.

The investigation is being pursued by the Jackson County Sheriff's Office and is ongoing. Anyone with information about this case is asked to contact the Jackson County Sheriff's Office. State's Attorney Michael Carr is handling the prosecution.

*A prosecutor has the responsibility of a minister of justice and not simply that of an advocate. This responsibility carries with it specific obligations to see that the defendant is accorded procedural justice and that guilt is decided upon the basis of sufficient evidence.
