AARON M. BODEKER, MURPHYSBORO, SENTENCED TO DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS FOR DELIVERY OF METHAMPHETAMINE

Michael C. Carr, Jackson County State's Attorney, announced today, Aaron M. Bodeker, age 27, was sentenced in Jackson County Circuit Court to the Illinois Department of Corrections after pleading guilty to Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine.

On August 17, 2018, a confidential source working with detectives of the Jackson County Sheriff's Office purchased 1.7 grams of methamphetamine from the Bodeker in Murphysboro, Illinois. Bodeker pled guilty to the Unlawful Delivery of less than five (5) grams of Methamphetamine, a Class 2 Felony, and was sentenced on May 28, 2019, to serve four (4) years in the Illinois Department of Corrections, followed by a two (2) year period of mandatory supervised release. At the time of this incident, he was already serving two separate sentences of probation on domestic battery cases, both Class 4 felonies. The defendant's probation was revoked on those cases and he was re-sentenced to serve three (3) years concurrently with his four-year sentence.

The investigation was conducted by the Jackson County Sheriff's Office. Assistant State's Attorney Andrew W. Suthard was responsible for the prosecution of this case.
