JACKSON COUNTY MAN SENTENCED TO DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS FOR AGGRAVATED BATTERY CHARGE

Michael C. Carr, Jackson County State's Attorney, announced today that a Jackson County man, Daniel A. Brooks, 27, was sentenced to the Illinois Department of Corrections for aggravated battery of another man.

Jackson County Sheriff deputies received a report that on June 24, 2016, Daniel A. Brooks had attacked another man by striking him about the face and head with a pistol. He was subsequently charged with Aggravated Battery, a Class 3 Felony.

Brooks pled guilty to the charge of Aggravated Battery on August 28, 2017, and was sentenced to probation, with certain terms imposed by the Court. Brooks did not comply with the terms as ordered, and a Petition to Revoke his Probation was filed. On June 3, 2019, Brooks admitted to the Court that he did not comply with Domestic Violence Counseling previously ordered by the Court, which was alleged in the Petition to Revoke Probation. The Court sentenced Brooks to serve three (3) years in the Illinois Department of Corrections, which will be followed by a one (1) year period of Mandatory Supervised Release. Brooks received the prison sentence because of his failure to abide by the terms as ordered by the Court.

The original investigation was conducted by the Jackson County Sheriff's Department. Assistant State's Attorney Penny J. Pierson was responsible for the prosecution of this case.
