## TARRIEL A. HUDSON, CARBONDALE, SENTENCED TO DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS FOR DOMESTIC BATTERY

Michael C. Carr, Jackson County State's Attorney, announced today that Tarriel A. Hudson, age 39, of Carbondale, Illinois, was sentenced to the Illinois Department of Corrections for domestic battery.

On January 18, 2018, Murphysboro Police investigated a report of a domestic battery. The investigation revealed that Hudson had battered his girlfriend. He was subsequently charged with Domestic Battery, a Class 2 Felony, elevated from a misdemeanor offense based on Hudson's multiple previous domestic battery convictions.

Hudson pled guilty to the charge of Domestic Battery on February 6, 2018, and was sentenced to twenty-four months' probation, with certain terms imposed by the Court with which he was to comply. Hudson did not comply in that he failed to report to the Probation office, and he did not complete the counseling and substance abuse treatment program as ordered. A Petition to Revoke Probation was filed. On May 20, 2019, during a contested hearing, the Court ruled that sufficient evidence was presented to show the defendant had committed multiple violations of his court order. On August 23, 2019, the Court sentenced Hudson to serve seventy-eight (78) months in the Illinois Department of Corrections, which will be followed by a four (4) year period of Mandatory Supervised Release. Hudson received the prison sentence because of his failure to abide by the terms ordered by the Court.

The original investigation was conducted by the Murphysboro Police Department. Assistant State's Attorney Penny J. Pierson was responsible for the prosecution of this case.
