REVA C. WARNSMAN, MARION, SENTENCED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS FOR RETAIL THEFT

Michael C. Carr, Jackson County State's Attorney, announced today that on March 9, 2020, Reva C. Warnsman, 35, of Marion, Illinois, entered a plea of guilty to Retail Theft, a Class 4 felony offense, and received a sentence of one (1) year in the Illinois Department of Corrections followed by a one (1) year period of Mandatory Supervised Release. Warnsman's Jackson County prison sentence will be served consecutive to a two (2) year sentence to the Illinois Department of Corrections imposed in a Williamson County case on March 5, 2020, for a total of three (3) years in prison.

On January 21, 2020, employees of Town Square Market in Carbondale, Illinois saw Warnsman take merchandise from the store, conceal the items in her purse, and walk out of the store without paying for the merchandise. Warnsman's actions were captured on video surveillance. Officers from the Carbondale Police Department arrived on scene and found over two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) worth of Town Square Market merchandise in her purse. Warnsman admitted to stealing the merchandise. At the time of this offense, Warnsman was on probation for Possession of a Controlled Substance (Class 4) in a 2016 Saline County case. Warnsman also had pending Retail Theft (Class 3 Felony) charges in Williamson County when she committed the Jackson County offense.

The investigation of Warnsman's case was conducted by the Carbondale Police Department. Assistant State's Attorney Jayson Clark was responsible for the successful prosecution of Warnsman.
